The Greek scholar, James Hope Moulton, tells us about the word translated “eager longing.”

# What is Radical?

1. Arising from or going to a root or source; basic: proposed a radical solution to the problem.
2. Departing markedly from the usual or customary; extreme: radical opinions on education.
3. Favoring or effecting fundamental or revolutionary changes in current practices, conditions, or institutions:

“The radical Christian is not a special Christian.  
He simply qualifies for New Testament normality.”

-Arthur Wallis, *The Radical Christian*

The number one characteristic of a radical Christian is that he or she loves God more than anyone or anything else.

“To me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labour for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body.”

Philippians 1:21-24

The second characteristic is that a radical Christian works hard at the work God has given him or her to do.

“By the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect. No, I worked harder than all of [the apostles] - yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me.”

1 Corinthians 15:10



If we want to be radical, if we want Jesus to be the root of our lives, then all that is required is that we make him the centre. It's not necessarily easy, but it's simple. When we do, then we will understand who we are, why we are here, the authority we operate in and the call of God we are commissioned to follow.
